Each school will hold an election in April to vote for their favorite book! Students in grades 5-6 must read <u>5 books</u> to be eligible to vote!

All students visit the media center each week with their Language Arts teacher for a time of independent reading and an opportunity to check out new books. Ask your child which day of the week is library day for his/her class and encourage him/her to have all library books at school on that day so as to avoid overdue books. We do not want any student to be without a library book at YIS!

The **Spring Book Fair** will be held March 18—21. Hours are 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. We will have a family night on Tuesday, March 19 from 6:00 pm – 7:30 pm. Students may pay for books with cash or a check made out to "YIS". Please **DO NOT** make out checks to *Scholastic Book Fairs* because we cannot accept them. For your convenience, parents may pay for purchases with credit/debit cards. You may also create a free eWallet account for your child online instead of sending money to school. Critical thinking is about curiosity, flexibility, and keeping an open mind. Critical thinking skills for kids are essential in developing their ability to analyze information, solve problems, and make informed decisions. These skills are necessary in getting a child ready to understand how things work in the real world. Encouraging children to ask questions, consider different perspectives, and evaluate evidence helps them become independent thinkers and prepares them to face challenges with confidence and creativity as they grow and learn. Besides gaining problem-solving skills, being able to think independently will allow your child to resist peer pressure, form their own opinions and trust their own thinking when they are asked to do things they don't want to do. Listed below are some ways you can help your child become a better critical thinker.

- 1 Think critically as a habit
- 2 Debate everything!
- 3 Provide access to diverse, quality reading materials
- 4 Practice Claim-Evidence reasoning
- 5 Help them learn from everything

*If your student has a fever 100 or higher they will need to stay home until they are fever free for a full 24 hours without taking any fever reducing medication such as Tylenol, Motrin or Ibuprofen.

*If your student vomits or has more than 3 diarrhea stools, they will need to stay home a full 24 hours from the last time they get sick.

*If your student complains of not feeling well at home before school, please keep them home. It is not fair to the other students and staff.

Students are not allowed to bring medication to school without permission. This includes inhalers and over-the-counter medications.

All 6th grade parents are reminded that they will need to present a S.C. Certificate of Immunization to York Middle School during Annual Registration. Parents will not be allowed to register their child without it.


Art News
