York School District One proudly announces its selection as a finalist for the esteemed National District of Distinction Award in the category of Academic Acceleration. This recognition is a testament to the district's steadfast commitment to innovative competency-based, student-centered learning experiences. Fulton County Schools (Georgia) and Denver Public Schools (Colorado) were also nominated.

Established by District Administration magazine, the Districts of Distinction initiative aims to celebrate school districts at the forefront of educational innovation, providing inventive solutions to complex challenges. Rooted in the belief that outstanding,

locally developed programs can inspire and be replicated nationwide, the award spotlights initiatives that significantly impact student achievement, engagement, and overall educational excellence.

As one of only two districts approved by the State Board of Education for implementing forward-thinking learning experiences, York School District One stands at the forefront of educational innovation. Elissa Cox, Director of Secondary Education, shared the district's transformative journey toward student-centered learning with its competency-based education partner, reDesign. After reviewing the district's portfolio of evidence, reDesign nominated York School District One for the prestigious award, highlighting the focus on student-centered learning, improved academic outcomes, and the design of professional development experiences.

The District was honored on December 13th at the annual Superintendent's Summit. Although not selected as the overall winner, this recognition is a powerful testament to the district's unwavering commitment to student-centered learning, academic excellence, and continuous educational innovation. Fulton County Schools (Georgia) was selected as the overall winner. Still, York School District One received a crystal award, engraved with the District of Distinction Finalist for Academic Acceleration inscription to proudly display.

therapists. Currently, eight mental health therapists are actively engaged in providing vital support to students across the entire school district.

Including these two new therapists signifies a significant enhancement in our ability to cater to the needs of our students. With each school now equipped with its dedicated mental health therapist, we are poised to offer unprecedented stability and support to students who rely on these crucial services.

Furthermore, it's worth noting that the grant is not a one-time boost but is renewable for a second year, ensuring sustained support for our students' mental well-being.
